

### **When, What and Why:**

- The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act) was enacted in 1990 and requires institutions to publish an annual security report, maintain a crime log, issue timely warnings and maintain crime statistics
- The Violence Against Women Re-authorization Act of 2013 (VAWA) extended reporting requirements to include domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking.
- The goal of the Clery Act is to ensure that students, prospective students, parents, and employees have access to accurate information about crimes committed on campus and campus security procedures.

### **Who is a Campus Security Authority (CSA)?**

- Anyone with significant responsibility for student or campus activities.
- Faculty responsible for students outside the classroom
- Employees whose job functions place them in contact with students or direct reports in a manner or situation in which they may become aware of any criminal offense which they are mandated to report.

### **What is my role as a CSA?**

- CSAs report allegations of crimes (attempted or completed) that are made in good faith meaning there is a reasonable basis for believing that the information is not simply rumor or hearsay.
- CSAs are mandated to immediately report allegations of crime to law enforcement when brought to their attention.
- Incidents can be reported to CSAs by anyone: a third party, witness or victim.
- CSAs must not further investigate on their own after reporting.
